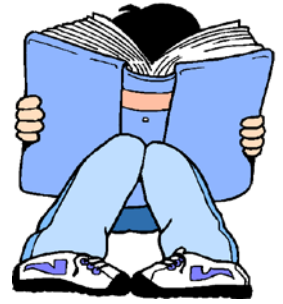
# Year 3-6

## Classroom Learning Focus Areas

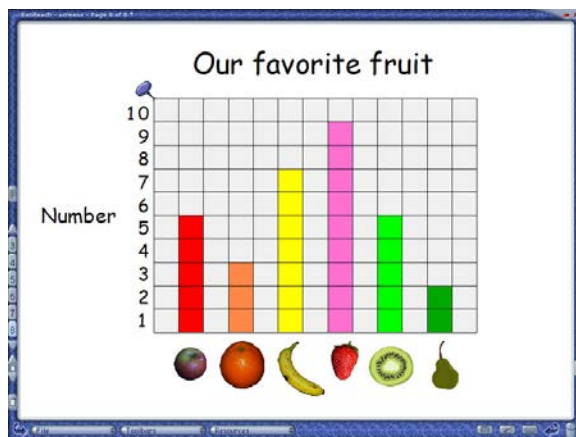
### English- Reading and Viewing/ Speaking and Listening

Students will be using an increasing range of skills, strategies and knowledge to fluently read, view and comprehend a range of texts on increasingly challenging topics in different media and technologies.

They will be planning, rehearsing and delivering short oral presentations, providing some key details in logical sequence. Students will also be listening to and contributing to conversations and discussions, sharing information and ideas and negotiating in collaborative situations.



### Maths- Data



Stage 2: Students will identify questions or issues for categorical variables; identify data sources and plan methods of data collection and recording. They will collect data, organise it into categories, and create displays using lists, tables, picture graphs and simple column graphs.

Stage 3: Students will construct displays, including column graphs, dot plots and tables, appropriate for data type. They will construct column and line graphs of numerical data, name

and label the horizontal and vertical axes and choose an appropriate title to describe the data represented.

Creative Arts – Exploring painting and drawing using different media – paint, crayons, chalk, charcoal.

Physical Education – Morning fitness will continue to focus on cross country training so students are encouraged to bring their joggers to wear just for this training. Sport will be league tag.

Science- Students will be reviewing what they have learned about earthquakes; comparing and discussing data about the occurrence of earthquakes in Australia and neighbouring countries; and suggesting reasons for the higher rate of occurrence of earthquake activity in some of Australia's neighbouring countries.
