

From the desk of the APCI

Parents often ask how they can help their children learn to read; and it's no wonder you're interested in this essential skill. Reading plays an important role in later success. Some studies even demonstrate that how well 7-year-olds read predicts income 35 years later!

Here are some practical recommendations for helping school-age students learn to and to foster a love of reading.

1 - Read to your kids

Research shows clear benefits for kids as young as 9-months-old and it could be effective even earlier than that. Reading to kids exposes them to richer vocabulary than they usually hear from the adults who speak to them and can have positive impacts on their language, intelligence, and later literacy achievement. Not only that, but it also models what good reading looks and sounds like. What should you read to them? There are so many wonderful children's books. Visit our local library and you can get an armful of adventure.



2 - Listen to your child read

When your child starts bringing books home from school, have them read to you. If it doesn't sound good (mistakes, choppy reading), make them read it again. Or read it to your child and them ask them try to read it themselves. Studies show that this kind of repeated oral reading makes students better readers, especially when it is done at home. Being a fluent reader (reading with a nice, natural rhythm) is the key to unlocking comprehension and understanding of a text.

3 – Ask questions

When your child reads, get them to retell the story or information. If it's a story, ask who it was about and what happened. If it's an informational text, have your child explain what it was about and how it worked, or what its parts were. Reading involves not just sounding out words but thinking about and remembering ideas and events. Improving reading comprehension skills early will prepare him/her for subsequent success in more difficult texts.

4 - Make reading a regular activity in your home

Make reading a part of your daily life and kids will learn to love it. Set aside some time when everyone turns off their devices and the TV and does nothing but read. Make it fun, too. When my children finished reading a book that had been made into a film, we'd make popcorn and watch the movie together. The point is to make reading a regular enjoyable part of your family routine.
