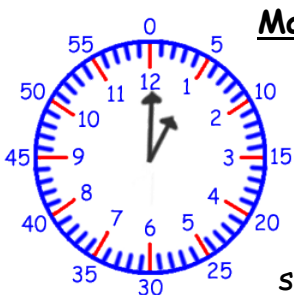
Years 3-6 News

We have had a very busy start to the term with everyone enjoying the opportunity to join students from Yoogali PS and Binya PS for NAIDOC Day celebrations last Wednesday. They rotated around a variety of indigenous activities, mixing very well with those from other schools. The social interactions are especially important part of these inter school visits.

Video Conference At 2pm on Tuesday, our class will be attending a VC (videoconference) titled "Now and Then at Vacluse House" with other students around NSW. This will be provided by Sydney Living Museums (Historic Houses Trust). This session will involve students in practical activities related to living back in early colonial times such as making butter.

Home Learning Students will recommence Home Learning this week. Tasks will be assigned based on the needs of the individual students of those who have returned their folders with completed tasks. All students are encouraged to do home reading and record this in their Reading Logs.

English Our class will be focusing on various speaking and listening activities, vocabulary building and the use of various comprehension strategies to improve their understanding of texts they will be reading. They will be learning to understand and adopt the different roles in a debate and use information to support and elaborate on a point of view.



Maths Stage 2 will be telling the time to the minute and investigating the relationship between units of time both analogue and digital. They will also be recalling time facts and doing multiplication using X7 and X9 tables to solve word problems. **Stage 3** will be using 24-hour time and am and pm notation in real life situations, and constructing timelines. All students will be learning and revising the use of Roman Numerals.

Science "Among the Gum Trees" Students explore the life cycles and beneficial interactions between eucalypts and bees. They explore other beneficial as well as harmful interactions between animals and eucalypts. Students will conduct a fair test on seed germination of eucalypt seeds and test theories on why oil is present in eucalypt leaves.

K-2 News

K-2 had a very busy first week back last week with our NAIDOC Day celebrations at Yoogali Public School on Wednesday and black out on Friday.

We learnt very quickly how much we rely on technology and how we can actually still learn without it. We enjoyed sharing and writing about our school holidays with one another.

Last week we started our new literacy study on the book Elmer. We began looking at why the author uses particular colours when illustrating a story and why it's okay to be different or one of a kind.

This term we will be completing our Child Protection unit on Positive relationships, which works closely with our PDHPE units this term. If you have any questions about your child participating in the Child Protection lessons please just see me at a time that is convenient for you.

In Geography this term we will be looking at other countries and places in the world and mapping them on an interactive map using our flat panel technology.

We will also be covering some of the places in Australia that we may have visited before.

In science this term we will be looking at the night sky and recording and discussing our observations. This week we will be looking at the moon and how it changes. We will be using Oreo biscuits to make moon cycles.

This term I have two days in Narrandera for L3 training, one days training for PBL and a days training for the new learning progressions that will be implemented next year into our school.
